


Most want the CE selection process to be reformed so un-popular candidate(s) will not be re-selected as CE of Hong Kong.

CE Election Committee had been following a 'gradual' path of allowing only a close circuit of only 400 members, later on increased to 800 members.



Subject: A3(1) Meet 'the interests of the different sectors of society'

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
