## My views on constitutional development

(I have sent a Chinese email relating to the subject and received a returned message for being unable to fully decode my Chinese email, I, therefore, try to write in English and I am not quite sure whether I can express my points clearly.)

In the near future, that is, 10 years or so, I don't think there is possibility for HK to proceed to a general election of both Chief Executive of HKSAR and Legco. On the whole, I believe HK people are not yet qualified for a one-man-one-vote general election. It is meaningless to argue about patriotism for it is too abstract. It is absurd if, on one hand, the majority of HK people are patriotic as many would say, while on the other, public opinion poll from time to time would tell us only a small percents are favorable to the central authorities of their country. If the people do not respect the central government of the country, how can they support sincerely "one country, two systems"! A small gang of sham-patriots(司徒?, 李柱?, ?慧卿) are good at playing trick like affirming abstract and denying concrete, they always sing highly tune of patriotism and do whatever they can to oppose the central government. I would ask what country, or which country they love! A country is something real and led by a concrete government, it is not at all anything that can not be seen or felt.

It is also a pity there are still many HK people who are not able to see the true color of these politicians and believe they are working for HK people's interests. This part of HK people are like a blind flock of sheep who followed in the procession of 7.1 Demonstration and in the opposition of the 23<sup>rd</sup> Legislation, some of them did not even know what they were opposing to or what the 23<sup>rd</sup> Legislation means, still, a lot of these followers were only airing various dissatisfaction of their own with the HK government's policy, and unfortunately these mass different objects are raped by those small band of sham-patriots and then used as a weapon to fire at the central authorities and government of HKSAR. I would never think poorly of the quality of HK people but I do not doubt a resistance to China and its government remains in the depth of their hearts after a long time of more than 100 years' rule by UK. It is just like a child who is returned from a rich family to a poor one and the child was told all the time how terrible the poor family was, therefore, the child is easily led astray.
