
Subject A1(1) Hong Kong is an inalienable part of China



Sir,

- 1. The following in the government must hold no residence rights in other countries and must hold SAR passports:
- a. All Administrative officers from AO up to department heads and permanent secretaries (The EXCO members and "Principal Officers" already have no foreign residence);
- b. All civil servants of directorate grade 1 (DI) or above who are Chinese citizens as defined under the Chinese Nationality Law as elaborated in "the interpretation of Chinese Nationality Law when applying in the HKSAR" passed by the Standing Committee of the National People's Congress of the Chinese Government on 15 May 1996 That is, some expatriates are allowed to stay particularly for the professional grades
- c. All heads of statutory bodies
- 2. All candidates for LEGCO and candidates for CE must declare what passports they have hold since July 1997 (i.e. even if they had given up the passports). This information is for the voters' information in deciding whom to vote for.

Subject: A2(1) What should 'actual situation' constitute





Subject: A2(2) How 'gradual and orderly progress' should be understood




Dear Sir,


Subject:A3(1) Meet 'the interests of the different sectors of society'
