Subject: View on constitutional development

View on issue of principle and legislative process

---

Though my views on the issue are common, I still would like to send it and want the government will count.

Constitutional development in Hong Kong is controversial not only among local community but more apparently with the central government. Moreover, it is also influential to possible unification with Taiwan in future. Therefore I suggest the central government to handle the political development here in wider perspective. Meanwhile, the Green Camp has won the presidential election in Taiwan again. If result of the election is not changed, tension across the strait will deteriorate.

Latest survey shows that passion of Hong Kong people on demand for direct election of chief executive officer and legislators is fading. The percentage has decreased from 70% to 60%. It is probably because of recent improvement of economy. Therefore if the central government want to deter constitutional development in Hong Kong, enhancing our economy should be an effective method. Second, they should prevent another incompetent CEO like Tung Che Wah to appear. If another fool is appointed through the 800 members electorate, it will raise deeper anger to the people than last year.

One country two systems is laid down in Basic Law. But now it seems this principle may not work or the central government do not want it to be implemented. Probably it is because China has not seen any democratic development on mainland since the handover of sovereignty. I think the ministers do not have solutions to Taiwan and Hong Kong issues. In pessimistic view constitution in Hong Kong will not be changed for 50 years

till 2047.
