Dear Mr. Tsang,

Please refer to the two letters written to you as mentioned below:

- 1) Letter dated 12 January 2004 addressed to you by our president, Hilton Cheong-Leen, and
- Letter dated 2 March 2004 addresses to you and signed jointly by our president, Hilton Cheong-Leen and our chairman, Frederick Lynn.

At our Constitutional Affairs Committee meeting, held on 30 March 2004, it was noted that there have been many divergent views within the community on whether the Chief Executive should be elected in 2007 by universal suffrage, and also whether the Legislature should all be elected by universal suffrage in 2008.

Our Constitutional Affairs Committee takes note of the fact that a critical significant section of the community is concerned that Articles 45 and 68 of the Basic Law should in this regard be followed both in the spirit and in implementation; i.e............ in the light of the "actual situation" in the HKSAR and in accordance with the "principle of gradual and orderly progress." Our Association subscribes to such a position.

In terms of implementation, our Constitutional Affair Committee would propose that the suggestions in our letter of 2 March 2004 would be in the main come within a reasonably acceptable interpretation of the meaning and intent of Articles 45 and 68, as a basis for discussion and forward progress for the 2007/2008 period.

The suggestion in our letter of 12 January 2004 are part of a progressive roadmap towards universal suffrage, in line with the "actual situation" in Hong Kong. Together with other views from the public, our suggestions could be reviewed as to suitability in time for



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the Chief Executive/Legislature 2012/2012 election cycle, following the "principle of gradual and orderly progress", and taking into account Hong Kong's overall economic sustainability, plus social, political and cultural development by that time.

May we request that our views be conveyed to the relevant authorities having to do with Hong Kong's constitutional development.

會司長 閣下:

本馅件仍有關本會先前呈交給 閣下的兩封函件(下列):

- (1) 本會會長張有興先生於 2004 年 1 月 12 日所呈的函件,及
- (2) 本會會長張有興先生聯同本會主席林國華先生於 2004 年 3 月 2 日所星的函 件。

在本會政制事務委員會於 2004 年 3 月 30 日舉行之會簽、我們注意到社會 人士對行政長官歷否在 2007 年由普遍產生及立法會議員應否在 2008 年由普選 產生的辦法、存在很多分歧意見。

本會政制事務委員會亦注意到有爲數相當多的社會人任關注基本法第 45 與 68 條之條文內容·認爲在考慮政改時必須貫徹上述兩項基本法條文的精神及 實施規定,即 "……根據香港特別行政區的實際情况和循序漸進的原則而規 定……" · 本會實同這個立場。

從進行條文實施規定而言·本會政制事務委員會相信我們上述第(2)函信內的建議大體上可以符合作爲討論與發展 2007/2008 年政改的基礎·

我們上述第(1)封函件內的建國,可說是一些比較長達的建議區向普選目標。該等建議是以香港"實際情况"的原則爲出發點。有關當局可把我們這些意見與社會人士的其他建議一起作檢討,看其是否適用於將來行政長官/立法會2012/2012 年度之選舉。在檢討時,需確保該等建議符合"循序漸進的原則",及考慮到香港整體經濟的持續性發展與配合香港社會、政治與文化各方面的實際情况。

我們感請 閣下將本會的政改建議轉交其他與香港政制發展有關當局。
