

When it was determined that HK people did not want the priviledge to vote, the opportunities had historically been limited which diminished civic consciousness. The throngs who marched all day in blistering summer heat emphatically proved public spiritedness.

May I suggest that the entire HK adult public with right-of-abode be invited to put forward candidates for Chief Executive with approval of those allowed to stand for election given by the legislative council.
